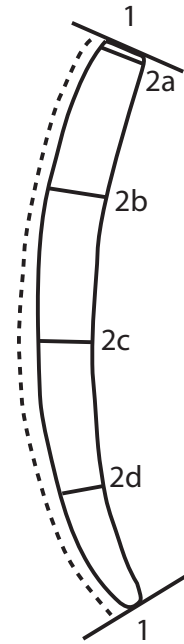
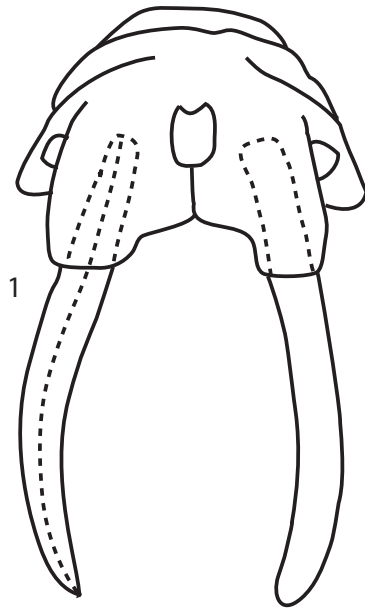

Instructions for Measuring Pacific Walrus



Instructions

All measurements must be taken with a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch wide flexible steel measuring tape to the nearest one-eighth of an inch. Enter fractional figures in eighths, without reduction. Tusks should be removed from mounted specimens for measuring.

- 1. Entire Length of Loose Tusk** is measured over the outer curve from a point in line with the greatest projecting edge of the base to a point in line with tip.
- 2. 2a: Circumference of Base** is measured at a right angle to axis of tusk. Do not follow irregular edge of tusk; the line of measurement must be entirely on tusk material.
2b-2c-2d: Divide Length of longer tusk by four. Starting at base, mark both tusks at these quarters (even though the other tusk is shorter) and measure circumferences at these marks.
